#### 1.0 Brief Summary

Mount Kenya University hosted 3<sup>rd</sup> Summer School 2023 at the Mwai Kibaki International Conventional Centre (MKCC) at Mount Kenya University, Main Campus – Thika and at School of Business and Economics, Nairobi Campus. This 5-day workshop saw participants participate in panel discussions, company visits, breakaway discussions and excursions that culminated to the development of tools and strategies for next phase of ACCESS-UBL activities 2024-2025. The workshop brought together, 30 delegates from Germany, Tunisia, Ghana, Nigeria, Benin, Rwanda and Kenya. Previous Summer Schools were held in Ghana, Tunisia and Benin, with the 5<sup>th</sup> summer school to be held in Abuja from 30<sup>th</sup> July-4<sup>th</sup> August 2023.

ACCESS (2020-2024) is a strong network initiated by the University of Leipzig and six African partner universities in 2020 to identify and develop new approaches to the labor market needs in Africa.

The opening ceremony was graced by Prof. Dickson Andala, CEO, National Research Fund, Kenya. Other invited guests and panelists present during the opening ceremony were: Prof. Deogratius Jaganyi (Vice-Chancellor, MKU); Dr. Mercyline Kamande, (Deputy-Vice-Chancellor, Mount Kenya University); Mr. Douglas Kuria, CEO & Managing Director, NeoKenya Mpya Ltd, Kenya; Ms. Miranda Pendo, TVET Coord' KAM; Mr. Stephen Ogenga (MIEEE, FIET-K)-Director General, NITA, Kenya; Prof. Collins Miruka, Director, SBMS, Technical University of Kenya; Dr. Phelista Njeru, Dean School of Business and Economics.
